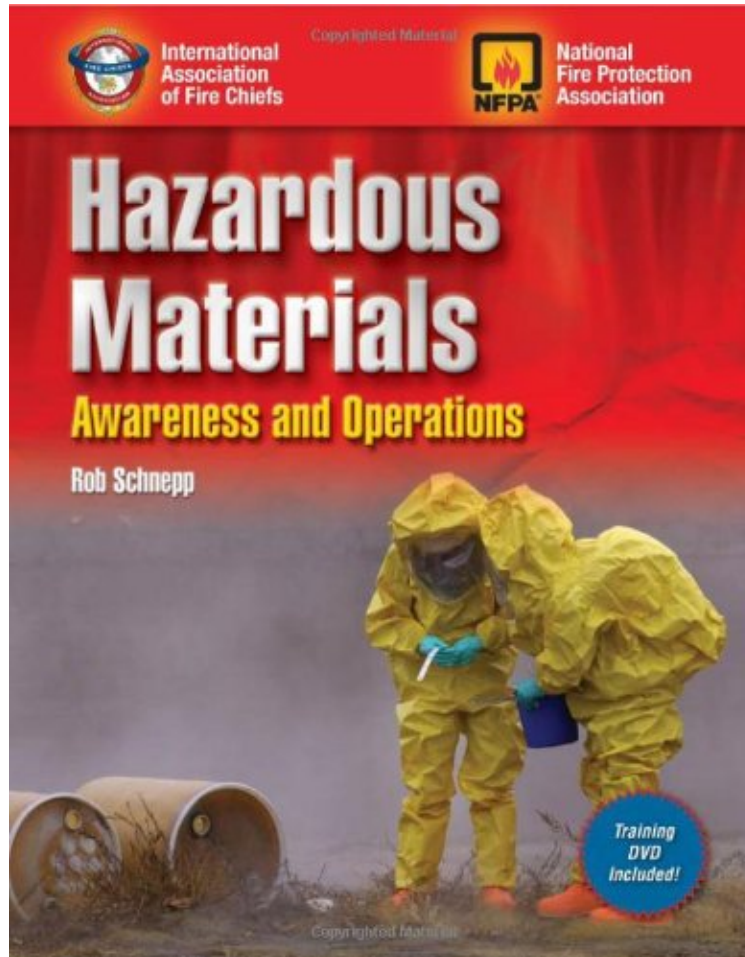

I did not think it was a "dry" book seeing the material it covers can be sometimes boring or complicated. The book is broken into the appropriate sections when talking about the training requirements set forth by the current NFPA standard. The new hazardous materials operations level is broken into competencies and this book set-up based on that. The beginning of each chapter shows the highlighted parts of the NFPA standard that the chapter will be going over, which is very helpful when you are testing the certification exams. I am not saying this book covers everything at the awareness and operations levels, but it is pretty close, but who says that you only need one book to study anyways?
