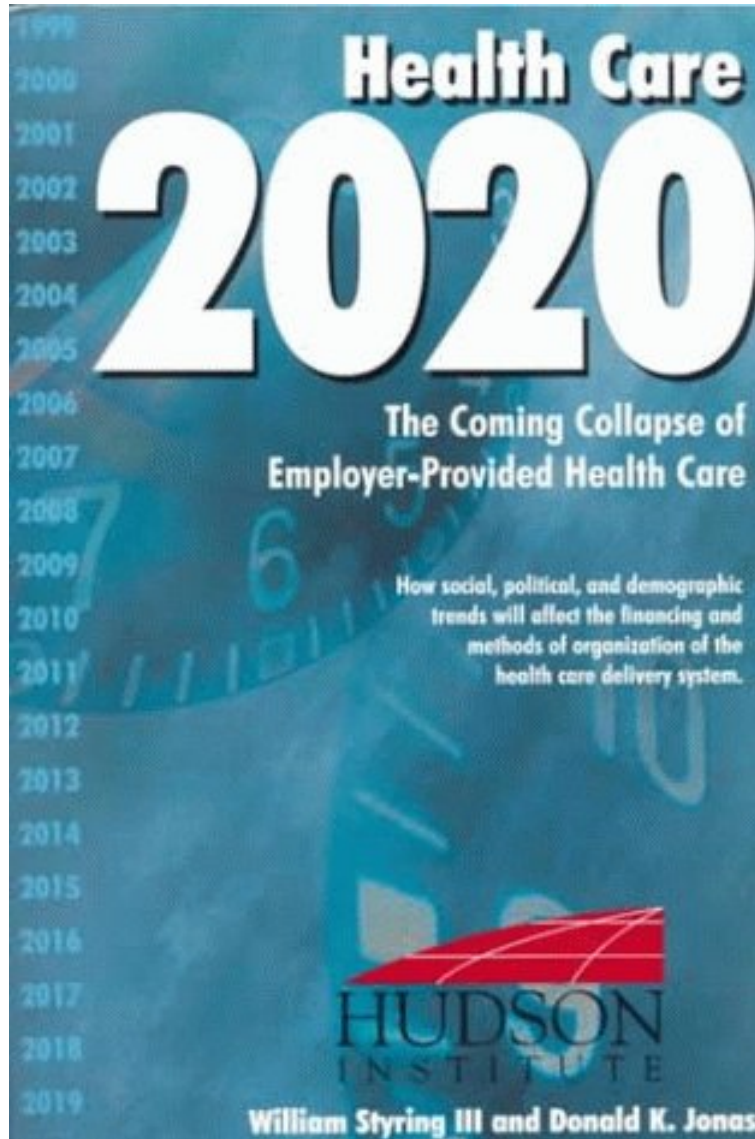

He retains the Benjamin Rogge Chair for Public Policy at Indiana Policy , where he was the research director. Previously, Styring served as vice president for public finance and education at the Indiana Chamber of Commerce. Styring is a magna cum laude graduate in economics from Wabash College and holds his M.A. in economics from Harvard University, where he was a Woodrow Wilson Fellow. He was chief of staff for the Indiana House Ways and Means Committee from 1969-1974 and economist for the Indiana Budget Agency from 1974-1979. He chaired the Indiana Revenue Forecast Committee from 1976-1984. A long-time member of the U.S. Chamber's Economic Policy Committee, Styring chaired the Chamber's Special Task Force on the Savings and Loan Industry. He is a consultant to the American Legislative Exchange Council Education and Economics Committees. Styring is also the only non-CPA ever elected to the Board of the Indiana CPA Society. PUBLICATIONS AND MEDIA EXPOSURE Styring is the author of numerous works on education, health care, and economics issues including "Health Care for Children: Expanding the Options by Looking to the Future" (1996), "Paying for Health Care: The Impending Earthquake," (Hudson Briefing Paper #197, November 1996), and "The Cost Effectiveness of Home Health Care: A Study of Indiana's In-Home/CHOICE Program," (Outlook, Vol. 1, Num. 11, November 1997). He regularly contributes articles to Hudson's bimonthly magazine, American Outlook, and has co-authored Health Care 2020 with fellow Hudson Research Fellow Donald Jonas (Hudson Institute, 1999). He is a regular columnist for Indiana Business Magazine and appears often on local and national radio and television. He has contributed articles to The Wall Street Journal, The Indianapolis Star, and The Los Angeles Times. Don Jonas is a contributing author to Hudson's Workforce 2020, a book describing the challenges and opportunities for American corporations and workers in the early 21st century.
