Having been on the inside of Kaiser in California, Halvorson has an in-depth knowledge of the complex interplay between physicians, payers, patients, providers,

hospitals and the government. Four of his most powerful messages are how to harvest existing personal health records, the need to focus on chronic disease, how to create intermediary agents that pursue high quality and efficient care, and the fundamental necessity of universal health care coverage. Although that last reform is left-leaning, the author's perspective is balanced and he supports reforms to make health care markets work and reduce unnecessary administrative waste. One of his most resounding messages is that we get what we pay for in health care; currently we have over 9,000 billing codes for treating disease and not a single way to bill for a cure or maintaining wellness. As a health care professional for the past six years, I highly endorse this book to both novices and experts alike.
