About the Author

Jiwei Qian is a research fellow in East Asian Institute, National University of Singapore. After obtaining a BSc in Computer Science from Fudan University, China, he switched his field of study to Economics and travelled to the UK where he earned an MSc in Development Economics from the School of Oriental and African Studies, University of London. He developed an interest in health economics while a graduate student in the Department of Economics at the National University of Singapore from where he received his PhD in 2010 after writing a dissertation on health policy in China. His subsequent research on Chinese health and social policy has been published in journals such as *The China Quarterly*, *Journal of Mental Health Policy and Economics*, *Singapore Economic*, and *East Asian Policy*, and as contributions to several books and conference proceedings. Dr Qian's current research interests include health economics, political economy and development economics. Most recently, he has been working on a project dealing with social policy reform in China.

Aring;ke Blomqvist, a native of Sweden, received his PhD from Princeton University in 1971. He taught at the University of Western Ontario in Canada until 2002 when he moved to the National University of Singapore as Professor and Head of Economics. In 2009 he moved to Beijing to take up a position in the Center for Human Capital and Labor Economics Research at the Central University of Finance and Economics. Since 2011 he has resided in Ottawa, Canada where he is an Adjunct Research Professor in the Department of Economics, Carleton University. He also is Health Policy Scholar in the C D Howe Institute, Toronto, Canada. Blomqvist's two principal areas of research have been economics of developing countries, and economics of social policy, particularly in health care. His work in development economics included stints of teaching and research in West Africa, Pakistan, and India. In recent years, his research has focused on health policy and health system reform in China and Canada, and together with his graduate students and other co-authors he has published articles, book chapters, and reports, on these topics.
