Rock solid textbook in healthcare policyBy Steven PetersonIn the not-too-distant future, I expect to be teaching an undergraduate course on American health policy. This will be on my short list as I consider texts.Pluses: very good coverage of key issues in healthcare policy. The text begins with a Part I that considers the key actors in the healthcare system; the environment of that system; an historical analysis of healthcare policy in the US over time. Part II looks at a variety of healthcare programs--Medicare, Medicaid, and

healthcare for American Indians, Alaska natives, and veterans. Part III features just one chapter--the problems in the healthcare system related to the poor and disadvantaged. Part IV has two chapters, each addressing cost issues. The cost of American healthcare has long been an issue, as people pay a premium with not-so-certain results. Finally, Part V examines "contemporary issues in health policy," among which are medical technology, end-of-life issues, contraception emergencies, immigrants, Obamacare, and an exploration of possible healthcare futures. Minuses? The writing is hardly sparkling. The style is rather dry. Also, and this is not the authors' fault, the Affordable Care Act is described after its adoption--but before its implementation. Thus, the story is a bit unsatisfying, as students will have been exposed to information about the strengths and weaknesses of the program in operation. All in all, a good textbook. The book addresses the key problems of healthcare cost, access, and quality through analyses of Medicare, Medicaid, the Veterans Health Administration, and other programs, and the ethical and cost implications of advances in healthcare technology. This fully updated fourth edition gives expanded attention to the fiscal and financial impact of high healthcare costs and the struggle for healthcare reform, culminating in the passage of the Affordable Care Act, with preliminary discussion of implementation issues associated with the Affordable Care Act as well as attempts to defund and repeal it.
