Peggy and Howard run to Russia and discover alien technology, alien beings assimilating into human life (even appearing as human), and a secret Hydra base utilizing this information for their own gains. Stupid, Hydra. They should know better than to tangle with Peggy Carter by now. This was a great graphic novel story that seems to fit in more with the MCU canon... maybe even pointing towards the inhumans in the Agents of S.H.I.E.L.D. story line (which I hope bleeds into Captain America 3, though I'm not sure they'll do it this time.) The banter between Howard and Peggy does not disappoint, pretty much on par with the television show and First Avenger. The only mark against this story (and it's somewhat a minor one) is that the story itself feels a little wandering towards the middle of the last half. Peggy and Howard barely show and the story takes on a different feel. That's my only complaint.
