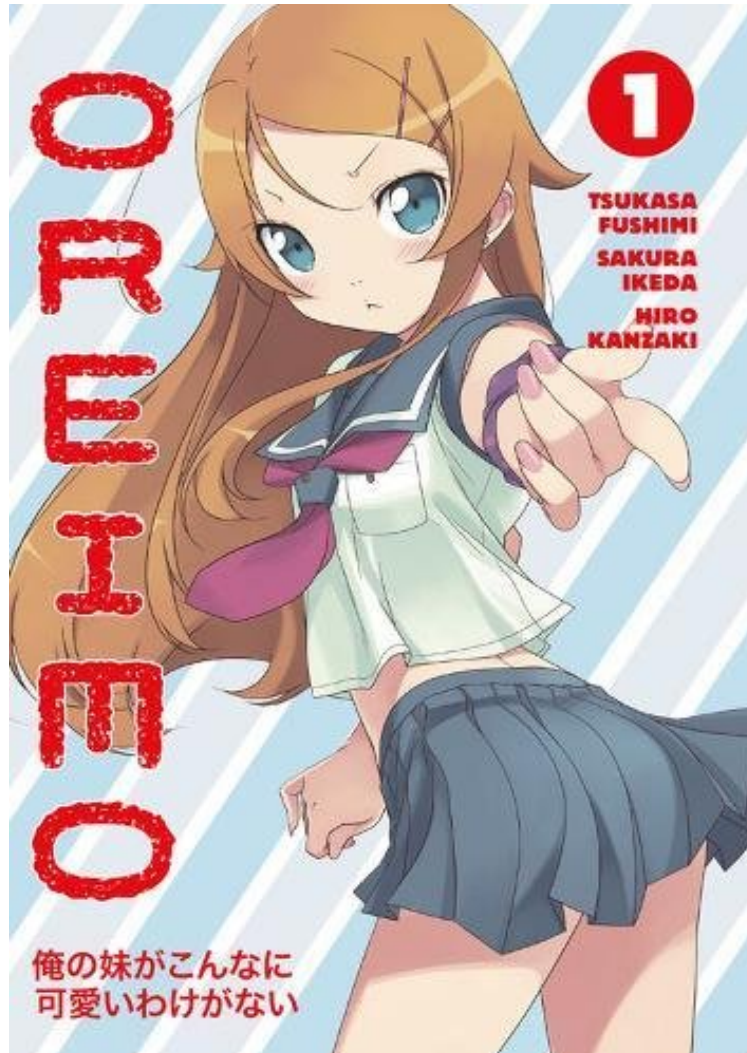

are frowned upon in Japanese culture) this Eroge peaks his suspicion, and he sets out to find the owner. Predictably, it is his sisters, she then begins confiding in him. Describing her life, he realizes she is 'The Perfect Daughter, and child'. Being a Model, Hard Working, Highest Grades Nation Wide, Best in Sports, Incredibly Social and Mature and never having a boyfriend, she is a parents dream. However this huge 'eroge' social taboo is the one thing she hides. This is the story of that.

Art: The Art is cute, and far more ecchi than the anime.

Anime/Manga Comparison: It's all pretty much the same, however, the sister is far more 'cute' and grateful in the manga than the anime. There is also ALOT more ecchi. Simple scenes from the anime, such as, when Kirino wakes Kyo up to start her "life counseling", by hitting him and yelling "COME TO MY ROOM YOU IDIOT!" are changed in the manga, so her straddling him and waking him up, only to say "please, be quiet! People are sleeping!" and when he does wake up, she says "We need to do this in my room!" far more ecchi than the manga. I don't know if this is for the sake of going in a COMPLETELY different direction bro/sis wise, or if it's just some harmless ecchi. We'll see.

First off, Kirino is extremely annoying in the manga versus the anime.
