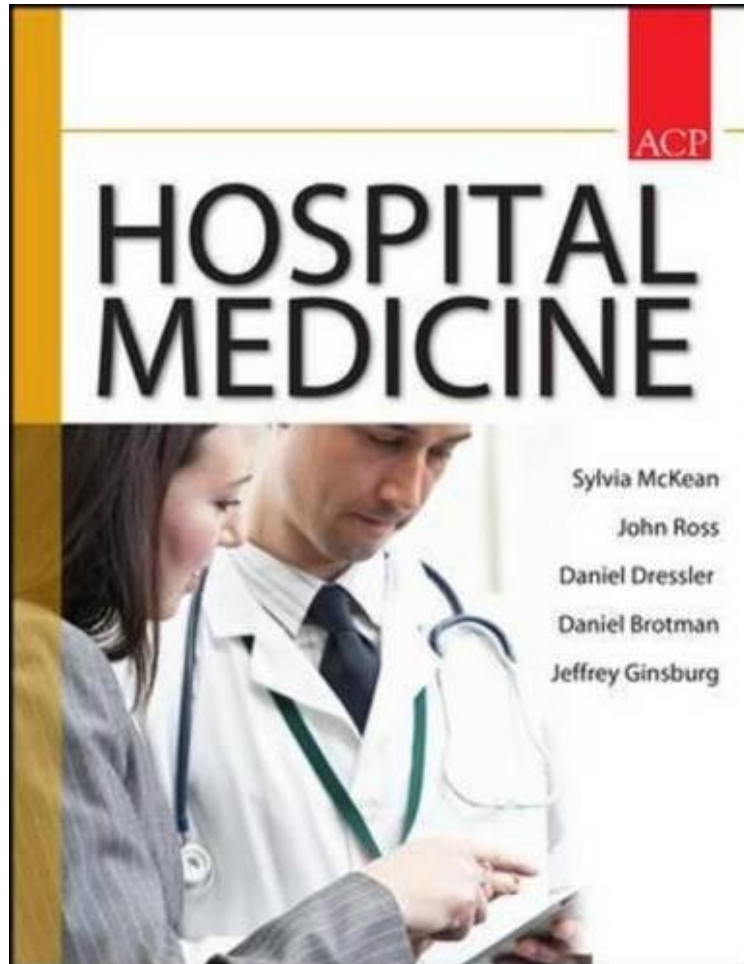

Lots of topics which are crucial for a hospitalist are not usually covered in traditional internal medicine text books. This book covers them all. It addresses the non-medical aspects of hospital medicine pretty well. The approaches to presentations are presented from a hospitalist stand point which is different from the traditional internist approach. Quite evidence based. Presents the results of important trials in tables. The level of depth and detail is tailored

for hospital medicine and inpatient encounters. So you may need to go back to Harrison's to get in-depth detail about certain topics. Overall I think this is a wonderful book. Medical Consultation and Co-Management: Reviews core tenets of medical consultation, preoperative assessment and management of post-operative medical problems. Clinical Problem-Solving in Hospital Medicine: Introduces principles of evidence-based medicine, quality of evidence, interpretation of diagnostic tests, systemic reviews and meta-analysis, and knowledge translations to clinical practice. Approach to the Patient at the Bedside: Details the diagnosis, testing, and initial management of common complaints that may either precipitate admission or arise during hospitalization. Hospitalist Skills: Covers the interpretation of common "low tech" tests that are routinely accessible on admission, how to optimize the use of radiology services, and the standardization of the execution of procedures routinely performed by some hospitalists. Clinical Conditions: Reflects the expanding scope of Hospital Medicine by including sections of Emergency Medicine, Critical Care, Geriatrics, Neurology, Palliative Care, Pregnancy, Psychiatry and Addiction, and Wartime Medicine.
