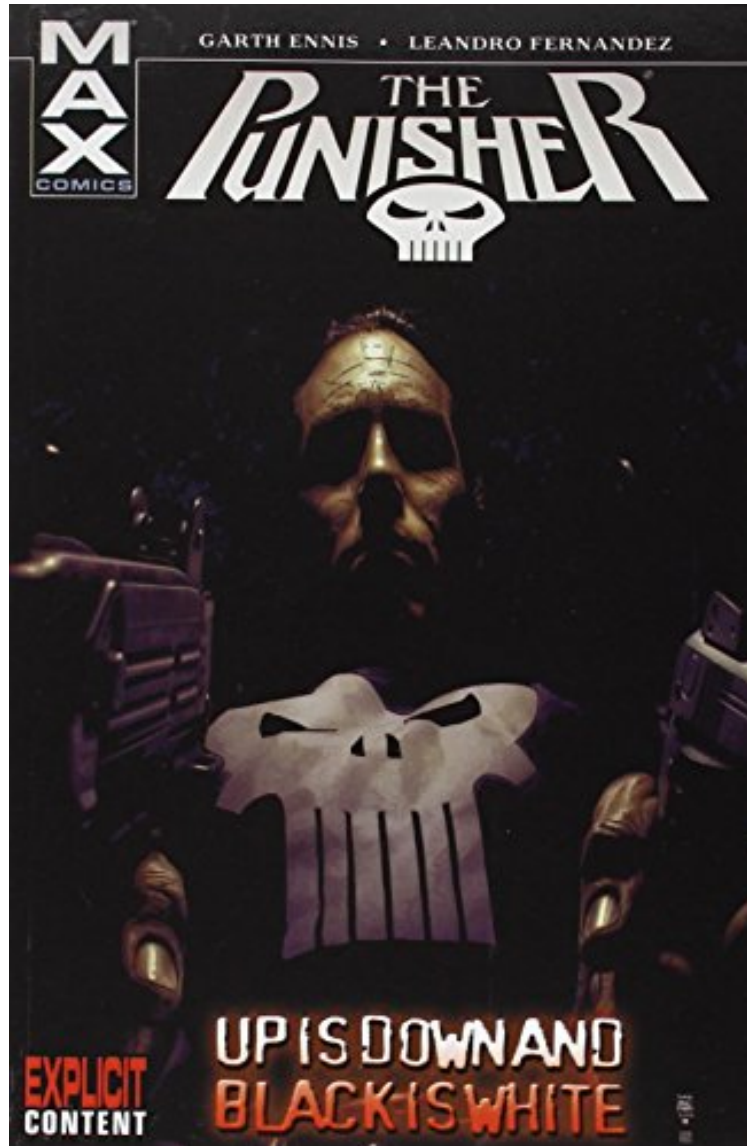

There are some REALLY disturbing moments in this book. Whilst I love reading these, it does make one wonder what goes on in that head of Garth Ennis'!! In this collection, gangster Nicky Cavella decides to call out Castle by disinterring Castle's family and urinating on their corpses and videotaping it. Bad, bad, bad idea. There are some things that just aren't wise and this is one of them. As you can well imagine, the body count is apocalyptic. Gallons of blood flow. While I like the fact that many characters are reappearing, it is easy to forget exactly what role they played several books ago. It is nice to see Castle back in the States and not messing around in spy-type stuff. Characters like Cavella, Teresa, and Rawlins keep the book interesting, entertaining, and disturbing. Cavella is the best of all of them in that he really is a fresh take on the mafiosi style gangster.
