There are a lot of layered story threads in Rat Queens. Best to start at the beginning. Continues the momentum built up in volume 1 without missing a beat. There's a lot of background on the leads here, always relevant to their current character and personality as well as to the ongoing story. Stjepan Sejic joins the art team, and his work is just as perfect for the book as Upchurch's. The plot pays off some ongoing threads while introducing more (including a big cliffhanger for next volume). However as good as the general story is, the true highlights of Rat Queens are its characters and their development. Despite how awesome everyone is I am developing favorites: Hannahs proving to be the surprisingly deep enigma I was hoping for, and everything Betty does sends me into a laughing fit. That said I could keep going with similar compliments for just about every single character. The cast is that good. More great stuff. Non-spoilers first, the writing on the spine of the book drives me crazy. One the first volume the spine says "Rat Queens Vol 1: Sass and Sorcery" the second volume says "Rat Queens Volume two" I understand, because the second title is really long, but still it is crappy planning. Are you writing out the numbers or not? Make up your minds because it doesn't match at all. That and the volume numbers at the bottom of the spine aren't the same size either. So if that type of thing doesn't bother you, you are lucky. *Very minor spoilers ahead*The villain in this book is a villain because his wife was murdered (its not really a spoiler, they tell us pretty soon) . I know, a dead wife should be sad. But honestly, I have read so many books and watched so many movies with dead wives/girlfriends that it honestly isn't sad anymore. It's boring and lazy writing and in the context of the book, the resulted villainy of the now widowed husband is a little unrealistic. So it has a few other moments that are a little bit cliché, but I do really like this series and would buy a volume three.
