The epic fantasy Ravine gets bigger in Volume 2 as Stjepan Sejic delves into the background of one of his primary characters, one whose anti-hero past is both dark and surprisingly light. Not only does Sejic grow the scale in the story proper but his appendix entries makes one wish he had the chance to draw them in epic art instead of prose. Stein and Lynn join together in their journeys out

of Palladia into the territory of the city-state of Wade during which Lynn comes to like the Wanderer, though Stein only tells his traveling companion half-truths about his life while avoiding the darker patches of his personal history. Meanwhile Lynns true past surprises and/or angers members of her former Dragoon squad who are sent to meet up in Wade. However Steins previous actions and his dark past have him being followed by the Captain of the Kings personal guard who along with a former rural guard-turned-travelling companion interact with someone close to Stein, how they are connected is easily guessed and later confirmed in the appendix tales. The end of the volume has Stein and Lynn facing off with a insane dragonrider terrorizing the trading routes in and around Wade and Palladia, the encounter makes the reader want to see more. Unfortunately for readers who love both Volumes of Ravine with Sejics magnificent art and great storytelling, Volume 2 did not sell well and thus Sejjic had to put this series on hold after waiting 11 years to publish this story.
