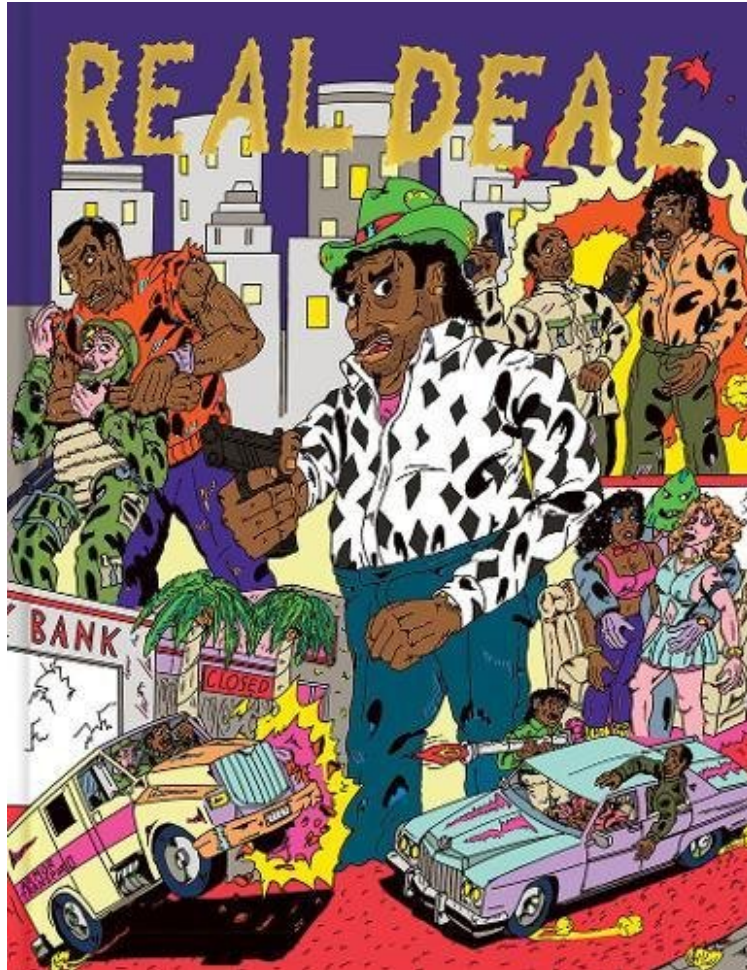

It's not as technically skilled and finely illustrated as the work of the Hernandez brothers ( Love and Rockets). In fact it's the opposite of that: crude, rude and relentless.The nonstop violence, astounding bad behavior and pitch black humor might seem over the top, but all of it is based on a hood reality that a lot of outsiders will never understand. Anybody that grew up in the ghetto- especially in the 1980's- definitely knew a couple of cats like G.C- hair trigger dudes in out-of-date clothes with bad attitudes and loaded firearms.The detail ( the depiction of the apartment building courts with all the garbage and police tape outside) the dialogue ("Your blood on the ceiling is gonna be what's up...") and the dark, dark humor.,these comics are real as hell.
