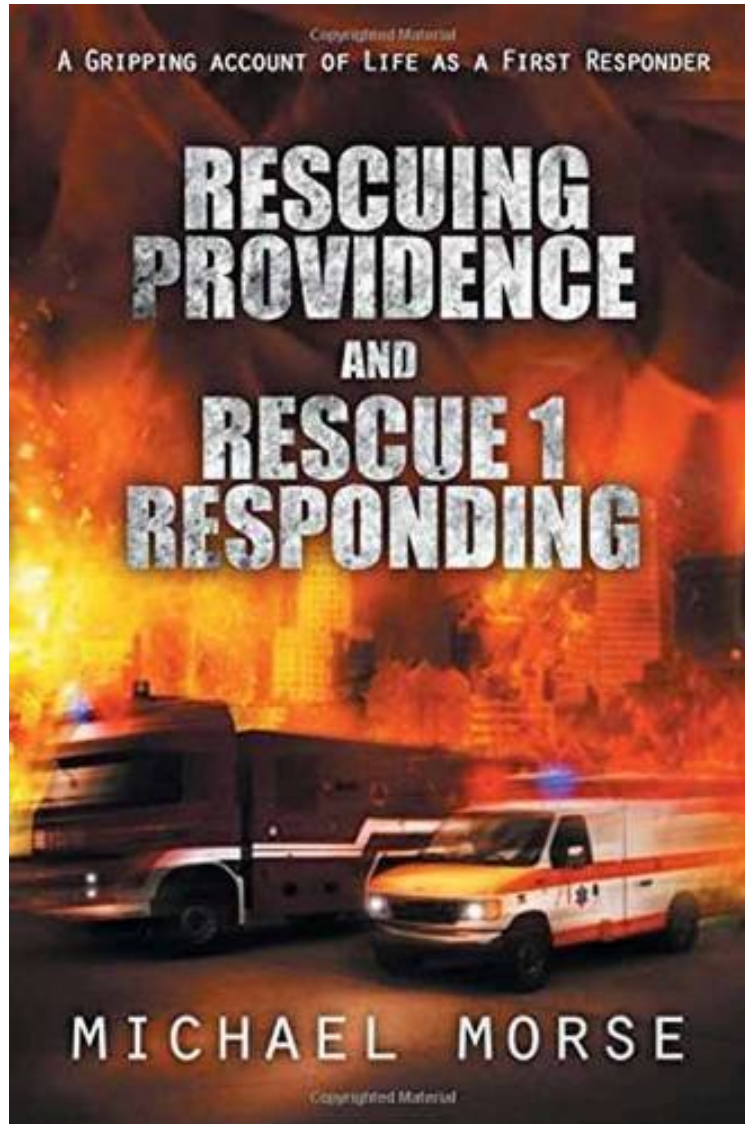

The author spent 23 years both fighting fires and responding with Rescue (EMS) Units. I found the stories highly entertaining and interesting. From the seriously injured to the patients just looking for a ride to their choice of hospital, the reader gets an insightful look at Providence and the calls the Fire Dept. responds to. With the exception of occasional misspells and grammatical errors, Michael Morse tells a good story. The stories deal primarily with the EMS side of the Providence Fire Dept. At times truly empathetic with his patients and at other times dismissive dependent on the severity of their complaint, Michael Morse gives the reader an inside look at the conditions encountered by an EMS provider in a big city environment. The slogan of the Providence Fire Dept. as explained on pg. 21 is "In omnia paratus", meaning- "in all things prepared." This slogan takes on added meaning while reading the stories in this book.
