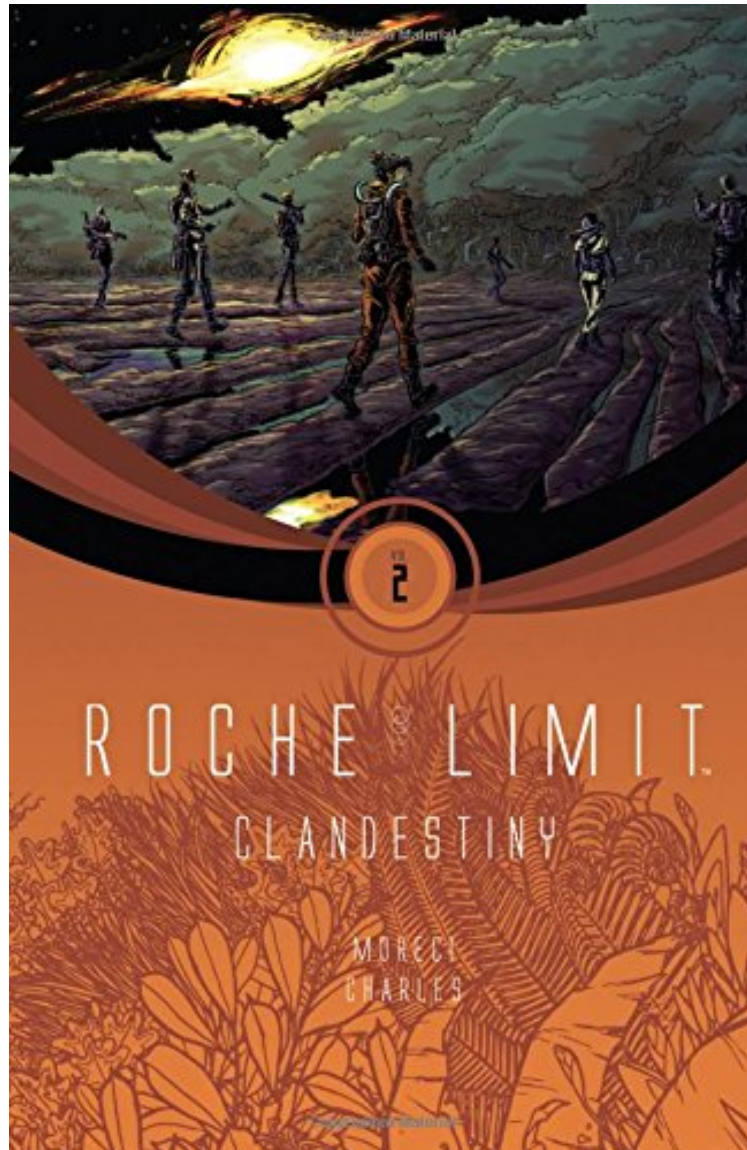

Volume 2 of Roche Limit tells a fairly standard science fiction (bordering on horror) story. A

ship is supposed to deliver secret military cargo to a planet that is supposedly abandoned, following the loss of a colony. A missile that brings down their ship causes the crew to wonder just how abandoned the planet really is. A worrisome note causes the crew to question what they've been told about their mission. And then there's the monster. This is a decent science fiction story, one that blends a conspiracy story with an evil alien story. That blend is a staple of bad science fiction, but Roche Limit rises above the average, in part because the evil alien monster doesn't look like a lizard. OK, some of the minor aliens have lizard tails, but the thing in the forest is more complicated. Nothing here is truly original, from the "I see my dead husband and daughter bit" to the "Aliens want to invade the Earth!" bit to the characters who don't get along until they do. Or until they die. Still, the bits are combined in a way that almost seems fresh. It kept me entertained all the way to the cliffhanger ending, and that's what counts. The story features reasonably good characters, some human, some robotic, some in the category of other. Drama and betrayal and snarkiness keep the plot interesting. The art is pleasantly stylish, although (as is too often the case) it is difficult to follow the action in action scenes.

This Volume 2 collects the five issues of "Roche Limit: Clandestiny". It follows after Volume 1, but apart from a few references to characters from Volume 1 and being set on the same planet 75 years after the events in Volume 1, this Volume 2 is basically a standalone. The story arc for these five issues is complete, although the open ending makes it clear that there is more story to be told.

MILD GENERAL SPOILER. In a nutshell, we have an expedition to the abandoned planet, carrying a secret cargo. Once landed, the crew members have to deal with head games that disorient their sense of reality; said bad vibes appear to emanate from some dark, evil force. Off we go to adventure, investigate and explore, and some crew members do better than others. After reading the first quarter of this book I had pretty much had enough. It was hard to tell the female characters apart, there was a bit too much crew disharmony, the drawings were all rather dark, there were lots of cryptic or angsty clues about crew member's backstories, and we didn't seem to be moving forward. There was also an emphasis on some android carrying on about humans being weak and selfish and unable to cooperate and so on. So, I decided to just skim through to the end to see if there was an interesting reveal. But, well before the end I found myself engaged in the story, interested in the characters, and impressed with the plotting. There was also some much needed monologuing that provided clarity about the earlier action. It was intriguing enough that I went back to the beginning and started over. This time I enjoyed reading the whole book and appreciated what the author had done.

Bottom line - there are at least five interesting characters; the pontificating eventually peters out; an actual plot emerges and picks up steam to a socko ending; second time through it's easier to recognize who is who; there are actually a few laughs and some well developed scenes. I'm glad I hung in there - this is one of the better "crew-lost-on-a-weird-forbidden-planet" stories.
