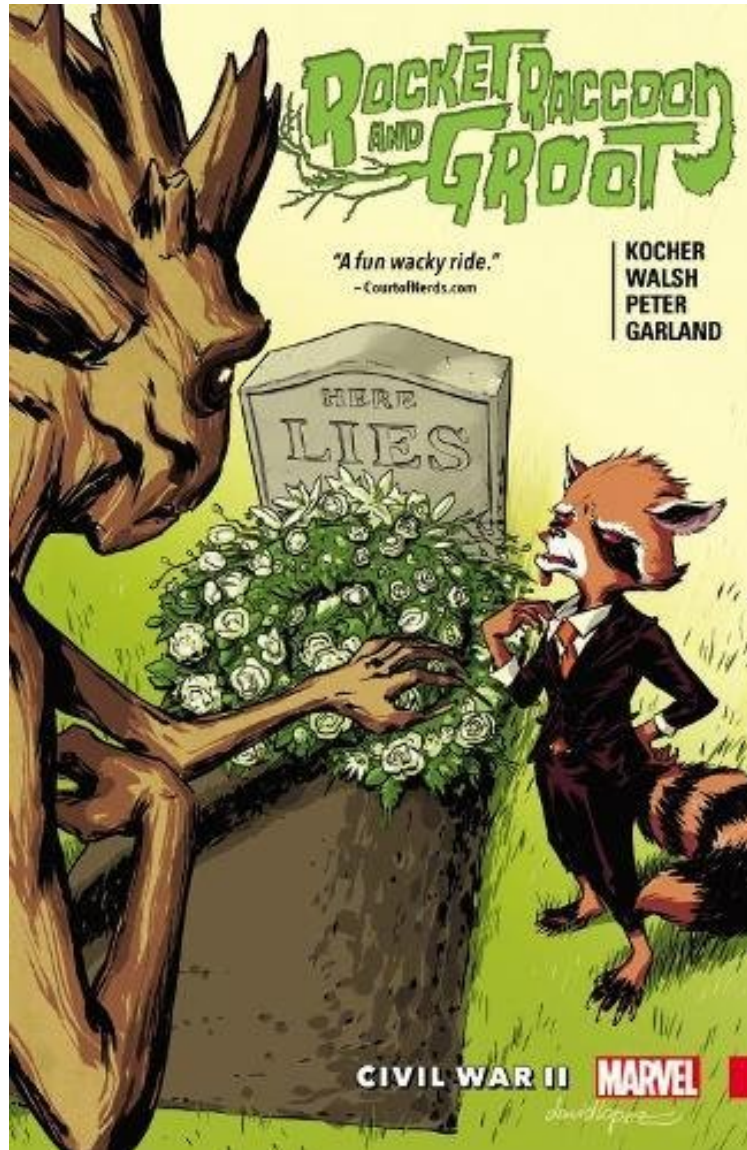


Rocket Raccoon Groot Vol. 2
