Bland Wanted ripoffBy brutusmuktukA quick overview of the main hero's origins, issue one of Romulus doesn't quite do enough to make the reader care for the story or Ashlar, the hero. Those familiar with Wanted will recognize the main plot, though this moves much quicker. Too quickly, perhaps. Much of the story is told through narration, and it skips through time from beginning to present in rapid-fire mode.Those who love action may find something to interest them here. Besides the short clips of fights scattered at the start, there is a lengthy fight scene later on. The whole story's purpose is to give excuse to fight scenes between people with superhuman reflexes and strength. The problem is, I felt I didn't connect with Ashlar enough to care if she won. Her personality is nil. I'm glad the comic is aiming for a strong female character, but it doesn't matter whether your character is male or female if they aren't interesting people.But I like more than just a little bit of action. Perhaps this is the perfect comic for you and I may be the wrong sort of person to review it because I like some depth. The concept and execution just didn't interest me.
