The Series Turn In a More Serious and Epic DirectionBy MereChristianFrom what I have read of spoilers, Rosario + Vampire, Season 2: Volume 4 is an important entry in the series as it marks the transition from a mostly slice of life harem series with some fantasy, to a full-blown adventure series with elements of heroic and epic fantasy. It also marks the point where the relationship between Tsukune and Moka (as well as Moka and the rest of their friends) will be slowly cemented.As the last volume ended, Tsukune and

the girls had gone on a visit to their friend, snow maiden Mizore's, homeland. Once there, they were stunned to learn that Mizore must wed a stranger to keep her race going, according to a prophecy made by the leader of her people. When, with the help of Mizore's mother, Tsukune and his friends in the Yokai Academy's News Club go to rescue their classmate, they run into a surprise guest an extremely powerful vampire named Kahlua, who is Moka and Koko's sister. It turns out the strong Kahlua is the ambassador of a nebulous organization named Fairy Tail, who are in pursuit of some vague goal of harming humans and any human-sympathizers among the supernatural peoples. The issue is that Kahlua is incredibly dangerous not only due to her strength, but also because she is basically insane. She is gentle and hates hurting anyone or anything, but if pushed, she will go into a type of berserker mode wherein she will kill anyone in her way. Add to this that, even when badly wounded, she will keep going until her opponents are dead, she is dead herself, or she is ordered to stop, and this is bad. Though stronger than her, even Moka is challenged by her insanity-fueled insistence on fighting even with possibly fatal wounds. This volume managed to seamlessly transition from the lighter-hearted arcs of the past to a new story line, it also marked a turn towards some more serious treatment of other issues. We see that the girls who compete for Tsukune's affections are not just doing it for fun, but really love him and have feelings. It was both heart-breaking and sweet to behold, and promises some good story fodder for the future. Yet, at the same time, there was enough comedy and fun times to keep the series from actually getting into an overly dark and edgy territory. The fact that the author, Akihisa Ikeda, manages to balance this more serious turn, with the appropriate amount of lighter elements to keep the story just plain fun was impressive. I really enjoyed this series so far, and highly recommend both this volume and the other books in this manga.
