On the way the plane the group is on gets attacked by a

perverted gremlin who has a thing for Moka's and Kurumu's noticeable assets, and when they get there they are ambushed in the family compound. Who is behind these attacks as one by one the girls disappear? At the ice village, the discovery of a growth on the main ice pillar that supports the magic seal and helps the fairies reproduce brings dire news, especially when Moka's other sister appears and tells them the Fairy Tale is about to start the war against the humans. But she also warns them that Moka and their other sister Aqua should never meet. What does this all mean, and does a trip into the Rosario bring answers that Tskune and the others will need to know to face off against the sadistic, murderous Aqua as Fairy Tale prepares to attack.
