depicted in the film's climax. A lesser question answered is how the monsters would function in this world, which runs on very different logic from the show. It has a very simple foil too: the Rangers, given their own personal tragedies, could have turned out a lot worse. The new villains show that in ways Rita in the film couldn't. The film hints a future with Tommy in it. This gives the Rangers something to do until then. It could lead to an entire series happening between films, which is critical if Saban wants to stay competitive against Marvel. How the town reacts to Rangers being in it also reveals that this is definitely a world modeled after today, as opposed to an idealized 1990s. The only thing I was slightly irritated at was that half the book is a giant size "preview" of the current MMPR comic (which I actually bought and did not want to buy again). I paid like \$9 for this, pre-ordered and everything, and was disappointed in how small it was. I'm giving it three stars not because of plot (which is really why it's 3 stars instead of 1) but because of how they did this. There was really only enough comic in there for like one issue (which is like \$3.99 for normal comics). This really wasn't worth putting in a graphic novel for the amount of comic.
