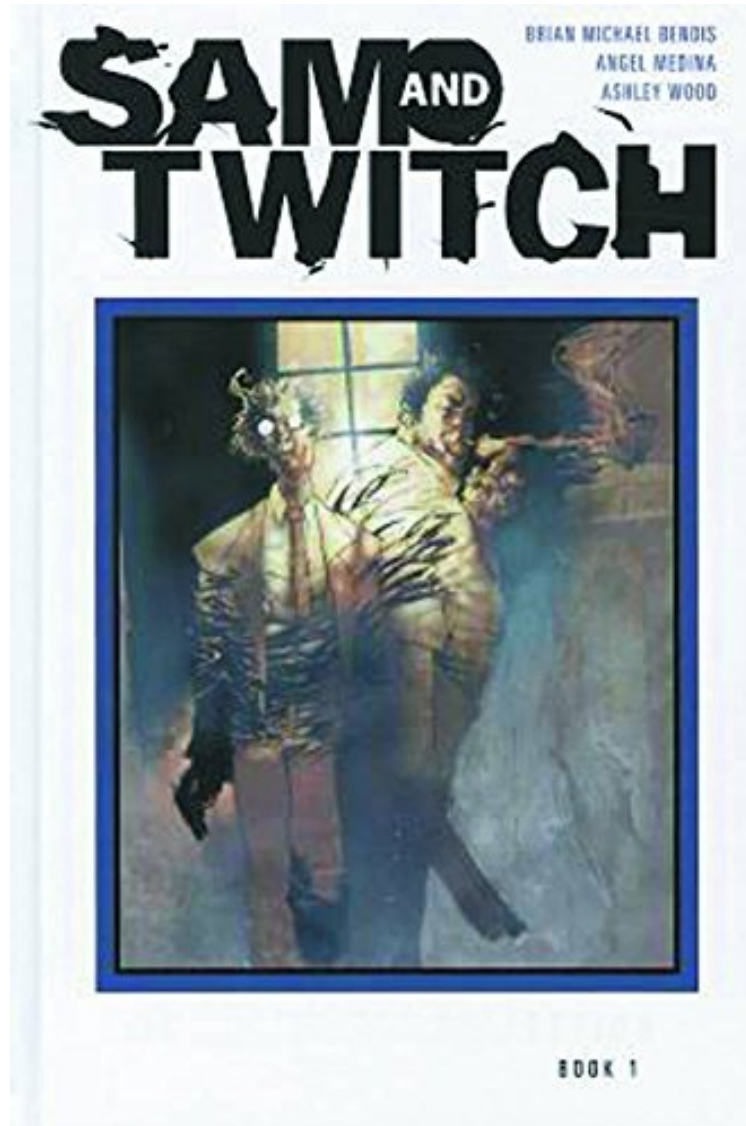

This is an nice sleek hardcover book containing the first 13 issues of Sam and Twitch, two characters whom were introduced in Spawn issue #1 in 1992. The cover doesn't feature a wrap-around image like the Spawn HC's do, but the cover is still sleek, with the picture above featured by in the center and the hardcover itself a smooth bright white. There is an introduction by Todd

MacFarlane explaining the creation of the characters and how he views them. There is also a reprinting of the letters by Brian Bendis from issues 1 and 2 also. The pages themselves are slick, lots of darks and grays, this is one dark urban detective tale after all. It contains the stories Udaku and Witchcraft. It also features some unused cover art in the back, some ink pages, a copy of the trade paper covers and a peek behind the creation of the series penned by Bendis himself (he is really down to earth and you feel as if he's talking to an old friend as you read about his experiences with the comic, his wife and McFarlane). The extra features are nothing to write home about, but collecting this wonderful series in such a beautiful package is well worth the price of 19.00.
