For the most part, McFarlane's writing is just as sharp in Savior as it was back in his 90's heyday.The story begins with a terrible and

deadly airplane crash onto a crowded highway outside of the small town of Damascus. The nation reels. The town of Damascus is devastated. The press is there with cameras and interviews and non-stop commentary. The masses descend to share in the grief, to witness the spectacle, and to bring the fiery condemnation of God upon victims, survivors and the mourners alike. A mysterious stranger wanders naked from the corn fields carrying a young victim of the crash, a victim healed by his magical touch. This "savior" seems as confused and bewildered by his power and identity as are those he touches. There isn't much more detail I can give without spoiling some of the high concepts that McFarlane and Co are attempting to accomplish with Savior. For the most part it works well, but there are a few areas that fall way short. For example, there is a subplot that involves DARPA (Defense Advanced Research Projects Agency) that completely falls apart with each issue. To the point where it didn't add anything to the story and could have probably been removed.
