The idea that the Skrulls have infiltrated Earth over several years could have really gone a lot of places this didn't instead appearing to be content with throwing a few twists out there and then having a massive fight at the end. I would have liked to see more of an explanation of how long some of the "replacements" were there, especially since at least one of them appears to have been there for a very long time. This also suffers from the weakness many of Marvel's big events have had over the past several years: Too many tie-ins. It used to be that crossovers took over the titles like Avengers and X-Men for a few months and you could follow them chronologically pretty easily. Not here. While you can read this volume and get most of the story, there are references to some things that are only fully explained in the tie-ins, and some things that are left unfinished without seeing the other collections. If you buy collections such as this and want to read the story in order, you are forced to figure out what the order should be by reading each volume, then jump back and forth between volumes at the appropriate times on a second reading.
