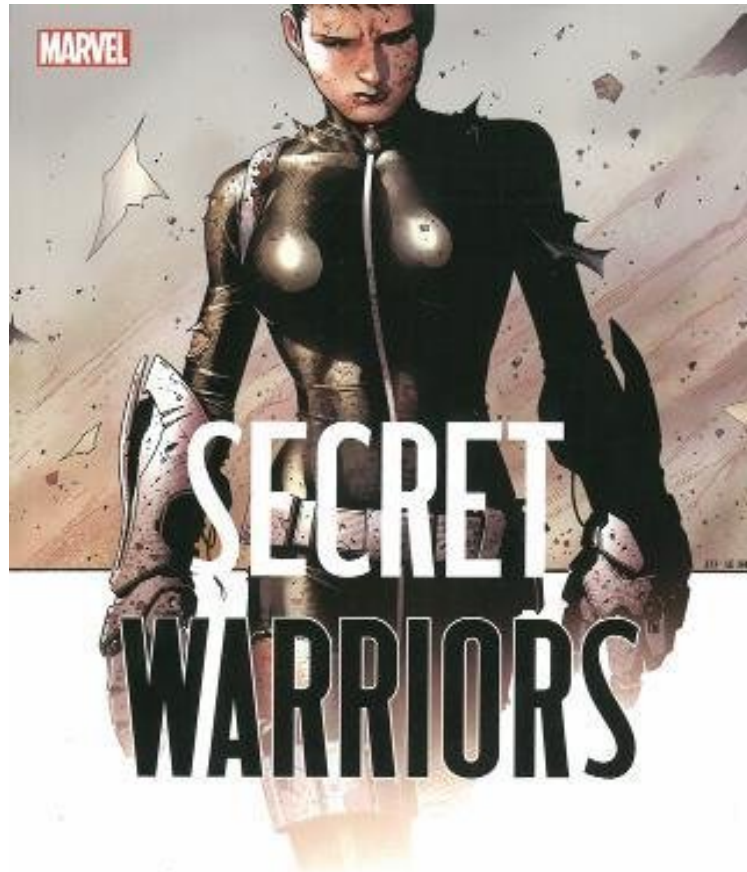

If you want to read this series, then this volume as well as the first is the way to do it, as the omnibus is rather difficult to find. On to the actual content. This book contains volumes 4-6 of Secret Warriors

(going by trade paperback numbering) and each of these volumes are split very well in order to tell different aspects of the story. Volume 4 is mostly a Howling Commandos story where we get to have a look at Nick Fury reflecting on how his life and the world around him has changed, as well as seeing some more of the world at large's reaction to the secret war occurring in this series. If you're a fan of the Howling Commandos, then this is a definite selling point. Volume 5 puts the focus back on various members of the caterpillar teams, and out of the three volumes collected feels most like the earlier story. We get to go in depth with some more of this supporting cast and quite a lot happens to them over the course of this volume. Volume 6 is where everything wraps up. It's a complicated volume, and much of it is told in flashbacks. This is a very hard volume to discuss because so much of what happens changes the way you look at the story as it's previously happened. We get a lot of depth in terms of how Fury, Strucker, as well as various members of SHIELD, HYDRA and LEVIATHAN know each other, and what connections they have in their past. The volume is once again a testament to how closely Jonathan Hickman plots his stories, and that's not even talking about the ending. With the amount of flashbacks in the volume, Hickman is also very happy to show how everything in this fits into the Marvel universe at large, and somehow he expands the scope even more so than before with certain revelations. The only potential issue with this volume is that the entire series was originally planned to be longer, so to some degree the ending of this book can feel overwhelming in its complexity. Volume 6 also has some direct tie-ins to Hickman's SHIELD, and so some stuff in this volume might be lost on those who haven't read this series (which is just as amazing as Secret Warriors, but quite different). This book, like the first collection also has some supplemental material within it, and this is great for those fans who want just a little bit more of this world Hickman is adding too. I'm no expert on art, but Alessandro Vitti gives lots of the book a very gritty feel with dark shading lines in general, while Mirko Colak later makes every character look cool and unique, and does some very neat things with light and especially with how he draws gunfire.
