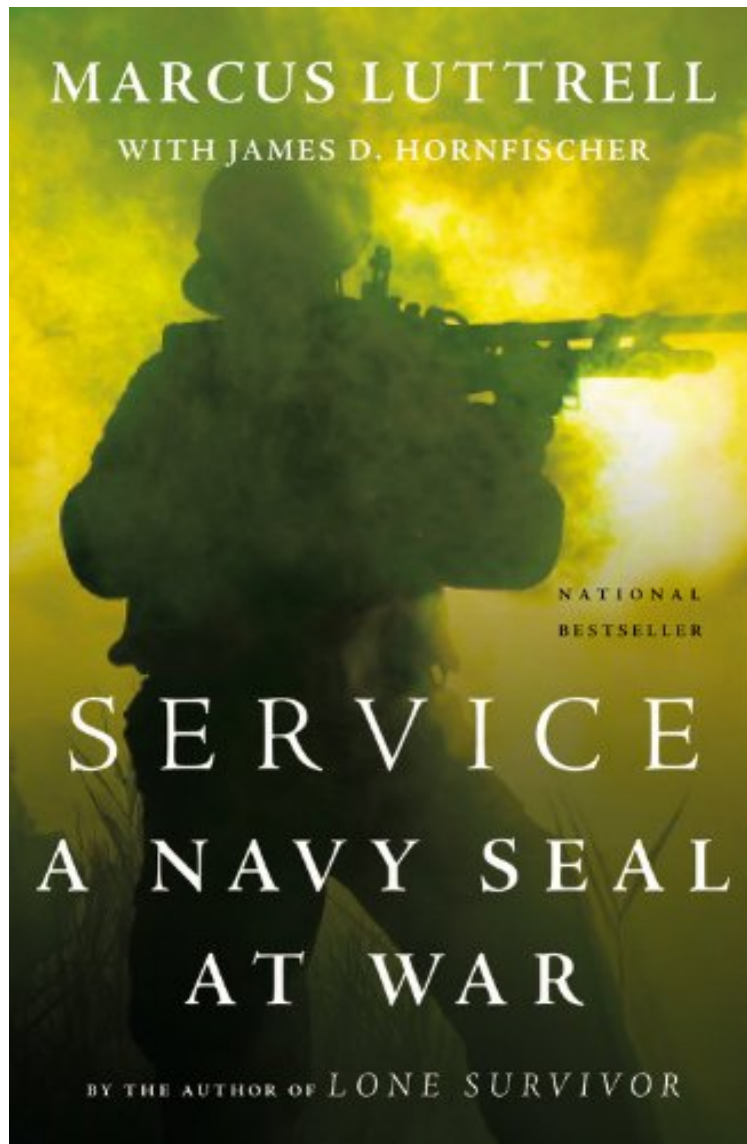

In Service he tells it like it was, sometimes graphically, about being with a different Seal team, being in close contact with his twin brother Morgan and how he fought the demons of his fallen friends. The moment I started reading this book I could not put it down. Not only did he talk about being deployed again but what life was like after he got out and being at home. If you read his first book Lone Survivor, I highly recommend reading this one. And if you haven't read Lone Survivor I would suggest reading that first before this one. It would help explain some of the things in the second book that have to do with the subject of the first book.
