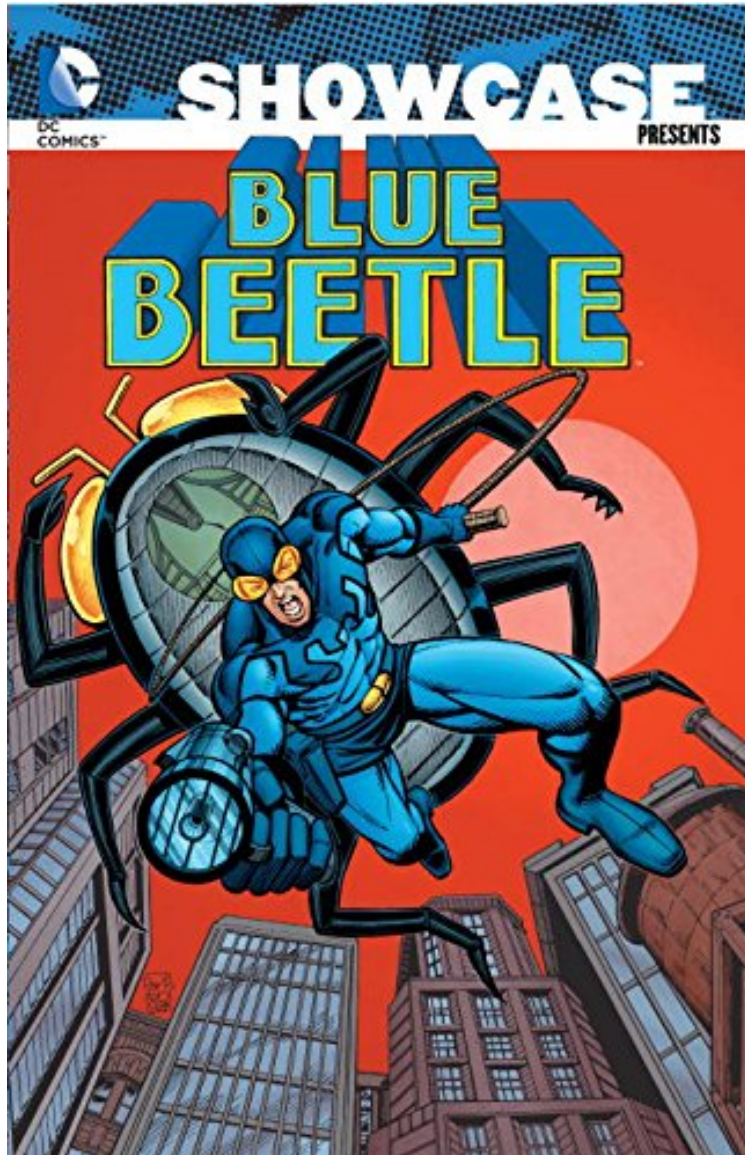

Buggy For Beetle By warren johnsoni was a comics collector from 1978-1991 and one of the reasons I started was because a friend of mine had about a dozen comics that he gave me and one of them was the Modern Comics reprint of Blue Beetle #1 by Steve Ditko, which to this day is one of my favorite comics so when he got his own title in the 80's I bought the comic. First of all I don't like the artwork of Paris Cullins-it's too cartoony for my tastes, I much preferred the Don Heck issues. As for the writing, Len Wein is one of my favorite writers but in this case -WAY TOO MANY SUBPLOTS GOING ON AT THE SAME TIME! I could not read the comic on a monthly basis because of this and had to wait a few months to read them all at once, and Len was also introducing subplots toward the end of the run which weren't resolved.
