However, this book kind of lost me. Kate is taken prisoner by her supposed sister, who demands Kates help in journeying to find Kates mother. Kate is forced to operate a strange magical gate of sorts and battle a family member that has turned into a giant purple crystal monster.

Then when Kate finally meets her mother she finds out that her mother is the head of some sort of secret society that has vast power over the universe. Does it sound confusing? It was. I am not even sure if the synopsis I provided above is really correct. It's very hard to follow. The illustration and action scenes were difficult to follow as well.
